

Slippery Slope to Strife

Proverbs 28:25 – He that is of a proud heart stirs up strife: but he that puts his trust in the Lord shall be made prosperous.

Proverbs 29:9 – If a wise man contends with a foolish man, whether he rage or laugh, there is no rest.

Proverbs 6:19 – A false witness that speaks lies, and he that sows discord among brethren. (Among the seven things that God hates)

Proverbs 13:10 – Only by pride comes contention: but with the well advised is wisdom.

Proverbs 15:18 – A wrathful man stirs up strife: but he that is slow to anger appeases strife.

Proverbs 17:1 – Better is a dry morsel, and quietness therewith, than a house full of sacrifices with strife.

Proverbs 17:14 – The beginning of strife is as when one lets out water: therefore leave off contention, before it be meddled with.

Proverbs 17:19 – He loves transgression that loves strife: and he that exalts his gate seeks destruction.

Proverbs 20:3 – It is a honor for a man to cease from strife: but every fool will be meddling.

Proverbs 26:20 – Where no wood is, there the fire goes out; so where there is no gossip, the strife ceases.

Proverbs 27:15-16 – A continual dropping in a very rainy day and a contentious woman are alike. Whosoever treasures up her restrains the wind, and the ointment of his right hand, which betrays itself.

Proverbs 30:33 – Surely the churning of milk brings forth butter, and the wringing of the nose brings forth blood; so the forcing of wrath brings forth strife.

Proverbs 29:11 – A fool utters all his mind; but a wise man keeps it in till afterwards.

Proverbs 27:19 – As in water face reflects to face, so the heart of man to man.

Proverbs 28:26 – He that trusts in his own heart is a fool: but whoso walks wisely, he shall be delivered.
